





#### **Book Review**

The Limits of the Market: The Pendulum Between Government and Market - By Paul de Grauwe

De Grauwe provides lucid insight into a well-known political argument about the allocation of resources in an economy. In 13 chapters, he outlines the history of the tension between governments and the free market. He argues that market systems reach their limit as they increase public harms such as inequality, labour exploitation, pollution and economic recessions. After they provide bailouts in times of recession, governments take over with increased regulation but they, in turn, reach their limit when there is a lack of technological innovation, efficiency and material prosperity.

The author concludes that the current model of capitalism can only be preserved with policies to reduce inequality, environmental reform, strong democracies and international cooperation. The author draws from behavioural economics, collective rationality and theorists such as Karl Marx, Karl Polanyi and Vladimir Lenin to analyse the nature of capitalism in language that is clear, concise and free of jargon. He describes governments and markets not as opposing systems but as interdependent alternating mechanisms energised by one another over time. The state of the climate, poverty and inequality may lead to a potential rejection of capitalism but de Grauwe is clear that a pendulum shift in the direction of communism or socialism is not desirable. To achieve this, we only need to make it a moral imperative to set international reform in motion for the sake of the world we leave behind.
